## Principal's Message

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Dear Parents and Caregivers

Welcome back to Term 2!

We certainly had an eventful last two days of Term 1. I would like to reiterate that every effort was made to communicate with you as soon as we had information at hand concerning school closure and the early ending to the Year Six camp at Tallebudgera. There was a significant service delivery issue affecting our ParentSMS which was beyond our control – in fact this affected every Brisbane Catholic Education school. When it became apparent that texts were not being delivered backup emails were sent. It is important for effective communication with you that you ensure that your contact details are up to date.

You will have received information concerning the reconvening of the Year Six camp on Monday and Tuesday 12 and 13 June. These days will replace those missed due to the severe weather conditions we experienced.

### **2017 Student Residential Address Collection**

We have received notification concerning the 2017 student residential address collection. Every 4 years, The Australian Government Department of Education and Training collects student residential addresses for the recalculation of socioeconomic status (SES) scores.

Brisbane Catholic Education will centrally collect this address data and report on behalf of schools by 31 May 2017. We are required to provide the following Collection Notice to parents and guardians by 28 April 2017.

### **2017 Student Residential Address Collection**

This notice is from the Australian Government Department of Education and Training (the department), to advise you that the department has requested your child's school provide a *statement of addresses*, in accordance with section 21 of the *Australian Education Regulation 2013* (the Regulation).

A *statement of addresses* contains the following three pieces of information about students at the school:

- Students' residential address (**not student names or other identifying information**)
- Students' level of education (i.e. whether the student is receiving primary or secondary education)
- Students' boarding school status (boarders or day students)

## Authority for and Purpose of Collection

Consistent with previous practice, and following the *2016 Australian Bureau of Statistics National Census of Population and Housing (Census)*, it is timely that information held by the department is updated in order to ensure that Australian Government funding calculations for your child's school are accurate.

Under section 21 of the Regulation, a *statement of addresses* **must not explicitly identify an individual student**. Accordingly, all information in the *statement of addresses* provided by your child's school to the department is de-identified.

## Use and Disclosure of Information

It is important to ensure the *statements of addresses* are accurate, and the department may from time to time carry out audits of *statements of addresses* to verify their accuracy. In the event of an audit, the department's contracted auditors may seek to compare a school's *statement of addresses* with student enrolment information held by the school for the purpose of verifying the information. The department's contractors will not use the information for any other purpose.

Any further use and disclosure of information relating to the *statement of addresses* will occur in accordance with section 65 of the Regulation.



## Student Well Being (Mrs Rebecca Thompson)

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The transition from holidays to school can be a hurdle, even for children who are eager to return to class. Everyone must adjust to the change in levels of activity, structure, and pressures associated with school life. Parents can help their children and family manage the increased pace of life by planning ahead, being realistic, and maintaining a positive attitude. Here are a few suggestions to help ease the transition and promote a successful transition back from holidays.



- Before School Starts Be sure your child is in good physical and mental health.
- Review information sent by the school, marking important dates on your calendar.
- Re-establish bedtime and mealtime routines as soon as possible.
- Remind children of the best spot to keep backpacks and lunch boxes, as well as a place to put important notices and information sent home for you to see.
- Avoid over scheduling extracurricular activities.

**Overcoming Anxiety** Do not overreact. Even if your child seems distraught at first, they will be fine. Remain calm and positive. Model optimism and confidence for your child. Reassure them that you love them and will be there at the end of the school day. Reinforce your child's ability to cope. Give them a few strategies to manage a difficult situation on his or her own.

You can get help by contacting the learning support team if serious concerns arise. Support can be provided that will help identify and reduce the triggers, as well as suggest resources within the school and community to help you address the situation. Remember, children are wonderfully resilient. With your support and encouragement, they will thrive throughout their school experience.
