Bullying No Way!

The national definition of bullying for Australian schools says:

Bullying is an ongoing misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that causes physical and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power over one or more persons. Bullying can happen in person or online, and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert).

Bullying of any form or for any reason can have long-term effects on those involved, including bystanders.

Single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying. Behaviours that do not constitute bullying include:

- mutual arguments and disagreements (where there is no power imbalance)
- not liking someone or a single act of social rejection
- one-off acts of meanness or spite
- isolated incidents of aggression, intimidation or violence.

However, these conflicts still need to be addressed and resolved. At St Francis Xavier we have a whole school program called Beating Bully Bulldozer. All classes will be working through this program during Term 2.

Students who feel they are being bullied are encouraged to speak with their teacher, or another staff member. If they feel that they cannot do that, then we encourage them to speak with their parents/guardians or use the Stop, Think, Do box which is located in every classroom. It is a way students can report an incident in a confidential and safe way.

To highlight Bullying No Way, students are encouraged to wear something orange or red on Friday 17 March. We are suggesting a t-shirt over their uniform, red or orange socks, or ribbons.

St Patricks Day – Friday 17 March



The Shamrock

One traditional symbol of Saint Patrick's Day is the Shamrock.

"Shamrock" is the common name for several different kinds of three-leafed clovers native to Ireland.

The shamrock was chosen Ireland's national emblem because of the legend that St. Patrick had used it to illustrate the doctrine of the Trinity. The Trinity is the idea that God is really three-in-one: The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit.

Patrick demonstrated the meaning of the Three-in-One by picking a shamrock from the grass growing at his feet and showing it to his listeners. He told them that just as the shamrock is one leaf with three parts, God is one entity with three Persons.

The Irish have considered shamrocks as good-luck symbols since earliest times, and today people of many other nationalities also believe they bring good luck.


GREEN

The Colour Green

Believe it or not, the colour of St. Patrick was not actually green, but blue! In the 19th century, however, green became used as a symbol for Ireland. In Ireland, there is plentiful rain and mist, so the 'Emerald Isle' really is green all year-round. The beautiful green landscape was probably the inspiration for the national colour.

Wearing the colour green is considered an act of paying tribute to Ireland. It is said that it also brings good luck, especially when worn on St. Patrick's Day.

Many long years ago, playful Irish children began the tradition of pinching people who forgot to wear green on St. Patrick's Day and the tradition is still practiced today.



The Celtic Cross

Saint Patrick was familiar with the Irish language and culture, because of his time as a slave there. When Patrick went back to Ireland to convert the Irish to Christianity, he was successful because he didn't try to make the Irish forget their old beliefs. He combined their old beliefs with the new beliefs.

One example of this is the Celtic Cross. Saint Patrick added the sun, a powerful Irish symbol, onto the Christian cross to create what is now called a Celtic cross, so that the new symbol of Christianity would be more natural to the Irish.

St Joseph's Day - Sunday 19 March

"Saint Joseph is a man of great spirit. He is great in faith, not because he speaks his own words, but above all because he listens to the words of the Living God. He listens in silence. And his heart ceaselessly perseveres in the readiness to accept the Truth contained in the word of the Living God," Pope John Paul II had once said.

There is very little about the life of Joseph in Scripture but still, we know that he was the husband of Mary, the foster father of Jesus, a carpenter and a man who was not wealthy. We also know that he came from the royal lineage of King David. We can see from his actions in scripture that Joseph was a compassionate man, and obedient to the will of God. He also loved Mary and Jesus and wanted to protect and provide for them. Since Joseph does not appear in Jesus' public life, at his death, or resurrection, many historians believe Joseph had probably died before Jesus entered public ministry. Joseph is the patron of many things, including the universal Church, fathers, the dying and social justice.

Harmony Day - Tuesday 21 March – EVERYONE BELONGS

Our diversity makes Australia a great place to live. Harmony Day is a celebration of our cultural diversity – a day of cultural respect for everyone who calls Australia home. The message of Harmony Day is 'everyone belongs', the Day aims to engage people to participate in their community, respect cultural and religious diversity and foster sense of belonging for everyone.

Harmony day is one of my favourite days of the year at St Francis Xavier. This year, on Tuesday 21 March we encourage all students to come to school dressed in their cultural dress. We will be having a cultural parade at 8.45am – giving all students the opportunity to share their culture with the school community. Students not wearing cultural dress are encouraged to wear orange clothes.

Every class in our school has a shared food experience, so we ask that every child brings a plate of food to share that comes from their family's cultural background. Some classes celebrate individually, some come together in year levels and some buddy classes get together to share the food experience. There will be reminders closer to the date but we ask families to start to think about what your child/ren will wear on this day, and the food they will bring to share.

CRAZY HAIR DAY – GOLD COIN DONATION

On Friday 24 March, 1B will be facilitating assembly prayer, raising awareness of epilepsy in our community. To help them raise awareness and some funds, which will be donated to Epilepsy Queensland, the class has decided to have a **Crazy Hair Day**. All students are encouraged to wear crazy hair to school and donate a gold coin for epilepsy awareness.

Improving Family Relations through Listening

Research on family wellbeing shows that when parents and carers communicate effectively to support each other, family relationships are strengthened. Parents and carers can set a positive tone for communication through their own example. The way you listen, and the attention and importance you give to what family members say, is as important as what you say to them and how you say it. This may not always be easy, especially when you are tired or busy and have to deal with complaining or conflict. However, listening and acknowledging others' feelings and wants, helps to reduce conflict and improve communication.



Reasons to work on listening:

- Listening carefully is how you gather information about what's going on in your child's life and head.
- Listening effectively builds strong relationships.
- Listening thoughtfully shows respect.
- Listening is always the first step in solving problems.
- Listening to your child's perspective will teach you a lot. Kids are smarter than most grown-ups think, and they generally know what they need. Listen to your kids, and they will teach you how to raise them.
- If you want your child to listen to you, you'll need to first listen to her. A child who is listened to learns how to listen. And until she learns how to listen to you, it's the same as telling your problems to the bathroom mirror—no matter how eloquently you express yourself, nobody will be hearing you but you.

Ways you can improve your listening skills:

- Be patient.
- Don't complete their sentences.
- Don't interrupt.
- Face your child and make eye contact.
- Lean forward, if you're seated, to show you're interested.
- Take advantage of passive moments such as watching a video, listening to music, or sitting on the edge of their bed when tucking them in at night.
- Take your children along on errands.
- Ask good questions but avoid the word "why."
- Ask their opinion about something that happened to you.
- Don't jump to conclusions.
- Don't change the subject. Make verbal responses such as "I see," "Really," "Uh-huh," to show that you're paying attention.
- Avoid telling them not to feel a certain way. ("Don't worry about it." Don't cry.")
- Turn off the TV.
- Put down the mop, newspaper, or dishtowel.
- Encourage them to tell you more. "What else did he say?" "What did he do next?"
- When they are telling of a struggle, rephrase and repeat what you heard. "What I hear you saying is that you feel I'm being unfair by not letting you go to the concert on a school night."
- Don't always point out grammar mistakes but listen for the point of the story.
- Let the phone ring if your child is in the middle of telling you about an event in his life.
- Anytime your child starts to talk or ask a question, consider it an invitation to which you should respond.
- Don't glance at your watch while they are talking.
- God gave you two ears and one mouth for a good reason. Listen twice as much as you talk!


