Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Caregivers

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data School Students with Disability



WHAT IS THE NATIONAL DATA COLLECTION?

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (the national data collection) is an annual collection that counts the number of school students receiving an adjustment due to disability and the level of reasonable adjustment they are receiving.

The national data collection counts students who have been identified by a school team as receiving an adjustment to address a disability as defined under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* (the DDA). The DDA can be accessed from the ComLaw website at www.comlaw.gov.au.

WHAT IS THE BENEFIT FOR MY CHILD?

The aim of the national data collection is to collect quality information about school students receiving an adjustment due to disability in Australia.

This information will help teachers, principals, education authorities and families to better support students with disability to take part in school on the same basis as other students.

The national data collection provides an opportunity for schools to review their learning and support systems and processes to continually improve education outcomes for their students with disability.

WHY IS THIS DATA BEING COLLECTED?

All schools across Australia collect information about students with disability. But the type of information currently collected varies between each state and territory and across government, Catholic and independent school sectors.

When undertaking the national data collection, every school in Australia uses the same method to collect information. Therefore, a government school in suburban Sydney collects and submits data in the same way as a Catholic school in country Victoria and an independent school in the Northern Territory.

The annual collection aims to, over time, lead to nationally consistent, high quality data that will enable schools, education authorities and governments to gain a more complete understanding of students who are receiving adjustments because of disability in schools in Australia, and how to best support them.

WHAT INFORMATION WILL BE COLLECTED?

Every year your child's school will collect the following information for each student receiving an adjustment due to disability:

- the student's level of education (i.e. primary or secondary)
- the student's level of adjustment
- the student's broad type of disability.

The information collected by schools will be available to all governments to inform policy and program improvement for students with disability.

WHO COLLECTS INFORMATION FOR THE NATIONAL DATA COLLECTION?

Teachers and school staff count the number of students receiving an adjustment due to disability in their school, and the level of reasonable adjustment they are provided, based on:

- consultation with parents and carers in the course of determining and providing reasonable adjustments
- the school team's observations and professional judgements
- any medical or other professional diagnosis
- other relevant information.

School principals are responsible for ensuring the information identified about each student is accurate.

HOW IS MY CHILD'S PRIVACY PROTECTED?

Protecting the privacy and confidentiality of all students and their families is essential and is an explicit focus of the national data collection. Personal details, such as student names or other identifying information, are not provided to local or federal education authorities.

VISA INTEGRITY AND CITIZENSHIP

If you have been recently granted Australian citizenship after the enrolment of your child or your visa information has changed please let the school office know – you will need to bring in the original certificate for sighting and photocopying.

At St Francis Xavier we believe that information about student learning should be gathered continuously and must be a dynamic part of the teaching and learning process. Reporting on your child's progress will take the form of parent/teacher interviews and the report card.

The reporting framework at St Francis Xavier in 2017 for Prep to Year 6 is:-

Term 1 – General Parent / Teacher Information Session

Term 2 – End of Semester Report (on Parent Portal – not printed) and Parent Teacher Interviews

Term 3 – Parent Teacher Interviews (if not completed end of Term 2)

Term 4 – Week 4 - Parent/Teacher interviews and Week 9 - End of Year Report – on Parent Portal

The government regulation is that schools will 'provide a written report, twice per year, against levels of achievement, within a 'five-point' scale'. For each Learning Area your child will receive a level according to the five point scale against the national curriculum standards:-

1. Well Above Standard (showing sophistication of skills and depth of knowledge)
2. Above Standard
3. At Standard (what is expected at the year level)
4. Below Standard
5. Well Below Standard

This five point scale will be applied to the overall achievement in the following Learning Areas from Prep to Year 6: Mathematics, Religion; HASS; Science; Health and Physical Education.

For English, the five point scale will apply to the overall achievement along with each of the Productive Modes (Speaking, Writing) and the Receptive Modes (Listening, Reading and Viewing). The Arts, is broken up into the areas of Media, Visual Arts, Drama and Music and all these areas will be awarded an achievement within the five-point scale.

Your child's teacher will also give them a mark for their effort in each Key Learning Area. The legend for effort has a four point scale. These are:-

- Consistently (All of the time)
- Generally (Most of the time)
- Sometimes
- Rarely

Assessment occurs throughout the year and should reflect student knowledge, skills and understandings. Assessment is an ongoing tool for students to use to set personal goals and for teachers to plan future learning experiences.






BOOK COVERING Helpers

Student Well Being (Mrs Rebecca Thompson)

Helping your child learn to deal with anger and calm down

Regulating emotions can be difficult for any child, and children with a natural inclination to anger quickly can have an especially difficult time. It is our job as parents to find ways to not only help them calm down when becoming upset but to help them learn to calm down anywhere and in any given situation. Let's face it, a large part of parenting is preparing our kids to be on their own in school for a majority of the day.



Here are some tips for calming an angry child, followed by some ways you can help your kids calm themselves down. These strategies will help them develop the necessary skills and confidence to navigate their anger better.

1. Be sympathetic.

What seems unimportant for you might be hugely important for them. When your child cries because she wanted to wear the red socks and you gave her blue ones, we may struggle to understand what the fuss is about. However, it is important to always validate their emotions, not negate them. If they find value and importance in something, it won't do any good to tell them that their understanding of importance is incorrect.


2. Give space, but don't isolate.

Children with an inclination toward anger will often have a predisposition toward physical aggression. A calm down corner provides an appropriate outlet for this aggression. Possibly providing some sensory tools (e.g., squishy ball, bubble wrap to pop, or maybe a pillow to hug) to help relieve tension. Your child might not like to feel isolated from the family or you when upset, but a bit of space can be a good thing. Including visual reminders of strategies may be helpful <http://childhood101.com/2015/03/helping-children-manage-big-emotions/>.



3. Remind them that anger is ok.

Emotions are a normal part of our development, and we experience a range of them every day. It is perfectly fine to get mad, to become angry. Any consequences that you provide for your child while they are upset should always be for behaviours, not for the emotion.



4. Don't over-react.

Model a calm voice and a calm demeanour. This is often easier said than done. The calmer you are, the better chance you have of your child calming down. Conversely, any yelling or aggression will most likely be matched by your child.



5. Active listening.

Children need to feel heard, especially when upset. Eye contact dramatically helps them feel that way. Allowing them to talk about how they are feeling will help make leaps and bounds toward calming down.


