Dear Parents and Caregivers


### Tomasi Update:

Plans are well underway for the removal of the current Tomasi block and reconstruction at a cost of \$2.4 million. The Tomasi block will be demolished during the June holiday break. Tenders will be called in the coming days. The current year 5/6 classrooms will be relocated to:


- Music Room

## Is my child eligible?

### Yes, if their name appears on a Medicare card and

- If your child is in grade 11 + 12 or under 4 years of age and receives the Commonwealth Dental Benefits Schedule they are also eligible or
- Any child aged 17 and under who are named on a current concession card (Pension/Health Care)

### Please note:

To ensure you are fully informed of your child's treatment, a **parent/legal guardian must attend** the first appointment to discuss your child's **dental/medical history** and to provide **consent** for treatment.

### Curriculum Planning

Over the past week, teachers have been meeting in their year level to begin planning for Term 2 learning and teaching activities. Teachers are using the language of Learning Intentions and Success Criteria with each student so that students are familiar with 'learning' language and able to explain what they are learning and how they are successful.

**Learning Intentions** are Informed by the curriculum, they identify new learning and focus on transferable skills, while informing the teaching and learning activities provided for students. These intentions will: -

- describe what students should know, understand or can do by the end of a lesson or series of lessons

The **Success Criteria** describes what successful learning looks like at the end: how the learner will know when they have reached/achieved the learning intention successful. Teachers use the curriculum to create and make clear and visible with students the success criteria for all targeted learning: short, medium and long term. They will be

- written in language that students understand
- focus on the learning and not on aspects of behaviour

Take some time during next term to talk to your child about what they have been learning about in class and if they feel they have been successful.

Please remember how important it is to make an appointment to meet with the class teacher for the formal Parent Teacher Interviews held in June/July and October. 


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## Library News (Mrs Louise Brooks, Mrs Kimberley Nearhos, Mrs Debbie Kenny)

### **Book Club**

Thanks for supporting the cashless Book Club this year. It seems that most parents have had no problems adapting to this method. Every purchase made gives the school "reward points" to buy items from Scholastic. So far this year we have been able to buy \$400 worth of books for the library. This is a big help in keeping new books coming onto the library shelves.

### **Overdue Books**

Every Monday emails are sent out to parents if your child has any overdue books. If the book is lost the replacement cost is on the notice. This should be paid using the QKR app. If the book is found and returned to the library the amount paid is credited to your school fees.

Library books should come back to the library every week. The routine for your child should be to bring their library bag in each week on their library day. If your child wants to keep the books for another week, they leave the books in their library bag but still put the library bag in their library tub in their classroom. We then check how long they've had the book and whether or not anyone else is waiting on the book.

*Monday* - Year 6s and Year 2s


*Tuesday* - Year 4s and Preps


