What is Saver Plus?

Saver Plus is a free ten-month savings program providing financial education, budgeting and savings tips. Delivered by Brotherhood of St Laurence, Berry Street, The Benevolent Society and The Smith Family and other local community organisations.

Participants receive up to \$500 from ANZ in matched savings for education costs for themselves or their children. Offered in communities across Australia in every state and territory

Who can join?

Participants must meet all of the below criteria:

- Have regular income from paid employment (themselves or their partner)
- Have a current Health Care or Pensioner Concession Card
- Be in receipt of an eligible Commonwealth social security benefit, allowance or payment

Developing Oral Language

Pay attention to what children are naturally curious about and involve them in conversations that build on their interests and encourage further thinking and exploration. Children will be most engaged in thinking about topics they have initiated.

For example,...

- 1) While washing hands together, pay attention to what your children is interested in. If he/she points to the water disappearing down the drain, build on his/her interest and get your child thinking with a comment like, "I wonder where the water is going."
- 2) Help your child create a menu for a pretend restaurant. When she/he tells you what she wants to put on the menu, follow him/her lead and ask questions that encourage him/her to draw on their knowledge and experience (e.g what should the prices be and which food items should go together in the same meal?)

- 3) When your child points to a picture, build on his interest by asking a question that encourages him/her to use his/her imagination. For example, "Yes, that's Clifford. Look how big he is! What do you think would happen if all the dogs who live on our street were that big?"
- 4) When your child points out an insect in the park, talk about how many legs the insect has and make an interesting comment like, "I am trying to figure out why insects have so many more legs than people."

It is well known that children learn best during the everyday conversations they have with the important adults in their lives. That's why the tips in this calendar centre around the things you already do with your child (daily activities, book reading, play, etc), making them easy to incorporate into your day.

PREP TO YEAR 3 SWIMMING



At the beginning of the term, all parents of students in Prep to Year 3 received an email to inform parents about the two block of swimming that will be occurring at the end of this term. Permission forms and payment is required for students to participate in this program. If you have not yet completed your child's permission note please do so as soon as possible and payment is required by **FRIDAY AUGUST 30th**. If you have difficulty in accessing these

please let your child's class teacher know.

Information about the P-Year 3 SCHOOL SWIMMING PROGRAM. (content from original note send via parent slips)

In the final two weeks of Term 3 (9th – 12th, 16th-19th September), the children in Years P-3 will attend a block of swimming lessons at Waterworx Aquatic Lifestyle Centre, Springfield. All children are expected to attend. The cost of the program is \$80 per child. This cost covers pool costs, instructors and transport. The cost of single lessons missed will not be refunded if a child misses a lesson, unless a medical certificate is provided. Such a refund would be credited to the school fee account.

Payment: Payment of \$80 in full to the office. This can be made through Qkr or by contacting the front office.

Students need a cap, goggles to take part in swimming lessons.

ICAS TESTS

On Tuesday the 17th September a number of students from Year 4-6, who registered earlier in Term 2, will complete the ICAS English test. These tests are optional and are organised by the UNSW (University of NSW). Students will receive their certificate when they arrive at school.

The Mathematics ICAS tests will occur on 19th September.

NAPLAN Online- School Readiness Testing (SRT) Testing in September 2019

Next year St Francis Xavier join a number of Catholic, Independent and State schools transitioning our students to the National NAPLAN Online program.

As part of our preparations, we will be conducting a 'School Readiness Test' (SRT) in September to confirm we have everything in place to administer NAPLAN Online successfully and seamlessly for our Year 3 and Year 5 cohorts in 2020.

The focus of the school readiness test is not on assessing literacy and numeracy skills, but to test school readiness in terms of IT capacity as well as logistics and administration processes. It will therefore involve simulating an online test for our students who are currently in Year 2 and Year 4 who will already be familiar with the NAPLAN style of testing and we expect it to only take approximately one hour. Students in Year 2 and 4 will perform an Omnibus test which is a combination of Numeracy, Language Conventions and Reading. Year 4 will also complete the writing test.

The School Readiness Test forms one part of our approach to transitioning to NAPLAN Online, with preparations well in hand with our teaching and IT support staff. Our focus for the remainder of this year and in the lead up to the online testing period in May next year will be to ensure our students are ready and confident, and we will continue to provide regular updates on our progress.

NAPLAN Online align with our *Excellent Learning and Teaching: Moving Forward* strategy at Brisbane Catholic Education and our commitment to improving literacy and numeracy skills and build the capacity of our students in information technology.

Help Your Child Thrive

All children thrive with structure, so it is very helpful when parents can help them develop daily routines. Whether kids are waking up in the morning before school, settling down for mealtime, going outside to play or getting ready for bed, they need routines to establish good habits.

Kids often don't feel like they have much control in their lives, and routines can help children can give them a sense of organisation, stability, and comfort.

Routines will help your child develop better behaviour and a sense of personal control. In addition to the emotional benefits, routines also have health benefits as well.

When parents teach their children to bathe and brush their teeth as part of a morning and night time routine, they instil good personal hygiene and health habits. Further, building in chore times during the week, like having children clear the table after dinner or tidy up the house at night establishes responsibility and work ethic.

Build a Visual to Support Health Routine Skills

If your child struggles with daily routines, get them to help and make a visual, so they can check off what they have to do and don't have to rely on reminders as much, See some examples below. Make one that suits your family.


